

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
TUESDAY JUNE 16, 2026

The regular meeting of the Lewisburg Area Joint Sewer Authority was called to order at 8:00 a.m. on Tuesday, June 16, 2026 by Rodney Hepner, Vice Chairman of the Authority, at the College Park Treatment Plant, River Road, Lewisburg, Pennsylvania.

Present: David R. Goodhart, Lawson Fetterman, Greg Beauseigneur, Josh Satteson, Scott Hahn, and Deborah Sills.

Also present were: Ken Potter, Solicitor, Todd M. Oberdorf, Manager, Tacie Shimko, Assistant Secretary.

Absent: Alan Zeigler and Philip Tharp.

Mr. Oberdorf announced that he became aware of an urgent personnel matter Monday morning. He feels that it needs to be addressed at this meeting and asked the Board to approve the amended Agenda. A motion was made by Mr. Satteson, seconded by Mr. Goodhart, and unanimously carried to amend the agenda.

No public comment.

A motion was made by Mr. Fetterman, seconded by Mr. Satteson, and unanimously carried to approve the minutes from May 19, 2026.

The Treasurer's Report for May was distributed.

Upon motion by Mr. Fetterman, seconded by Mr. Satteson, unanimously carried to approve the Treasurer's Report for May 2026.

The Investment Report for May was also distributed. (Copy attached)

A motion was made by Mr. Fetterman, seconded by Ms. Sills, and unanimously carried to add Personnel matters to the June 16, 2026 Agenda in order to resolve the issue.

Mr. Hepner called for an Executive Session to discuss Personnel Matters at 8:02 a.m.

Mr. Hepner announced that the regular meeting will commence at 9:06 a.m.

After a discussion, Mr. Fetterman made a motion, seconded by Ms. Sills, and unanimously carried to allow Mr. Oberdorf to increase employee pay and personal time on a merit basis.

Mr. Oberdorf reported that he has received Bucknell's and Buffalo Township Sewer agreements back signed by both parties. Mr. Satteson made a motion for Mr. Zeigler and Mr. Tharp to sign the agreements, seconded by Mr. Beauseigneur, and unanimously carried to allow Mr. Zeigler and Mr. Tharp to execute the agreements at their earliest convenience.

Mr. Oberdorf stated that he was only able to get two estimates to repair the small aeration tank. The first from Advanced Rehabilitation Technologies, \$61,620.00 with a 10-year warranty, and the second from Abel Recon in the amount of \$172,411.00 with a 3-year warranty. After a discussion and inspecting the samples, Mr. Beauseigneur made a motion, seconded by Mr. Goodhart, and unanimously carried to accept the bid of \$61,620.00 from Advanced Rehabilitation Technologies to perform the work on the tank, provided the Solicitor reviews the warranty and gives his approval.

Mr. Oberdorf reported that he called Gutelius Excavating, Watson Excavating, Glenn O. Hawbaker, Sikora Brothers, and Mid State Paving to get replacement estimates on the South Second Street pipe line replacement. Only two companies returned his call and provided an estimate, Gutelius Excavating in the amount of \$30,500.00 and Watson Excavating of \$24,500.00. After a discussion Mr. Beauseigneur made a motion, seconded by Mr. Satteson to hire Watson Excavating to replace fifty (50') of pipe with SDR 8" from the manhole at Market Street heading south on South Second Street.

Mr. Oberdorf distributed our monthly plant effluent data sheet. (Copy attached)

There being no further business to come before the meeting, upon motion by Mr. Fetterman, seconded by Mr. Satteson, and unanimously carried, the same was duly adjourned at 9:20 a.m. The next meeting of the Authority will be on Tuesday July 21, 2026.
